4	Updates a) b) c) d)	s and Announcements (as necessary) Councillors - Stephen Ferguson - Eaton Socon Councillor (David Giles) has had to stand down due to medical issues - congratulations to Stephen who was elected to be the Chair of Cambridgeshire County Council in his place. The County Council is going to remove the booking system from the household recycling centres in the near future. Big council tax rises are in the pipeline for this year (4.99% increase in the County Council share as well as the District Council share). Stephen asserted that it's a difficult decision for the Council to make given the rising costs due to the energy crisis and he is passionate in supporting the most vulnerable in the community. A Local Highways officer is due to visit on 22nd February to assess some of the ongoing issues on LF. The Mayor's Ball is due to be held on March 26th. The theme for the event is the 90s and the cost is £40 a ticket - all proceeds go to charity. Helene suggested one of the charities for the Mayors Ball to be the Community Money Advice Team. Stephen Ferguson was happy to support and accept the suggestion. Committee members - Lara - tiny library - lots of support for the installation of another library. 22 out of 23 residents surveyed were very supportive. Lara to continue working on this. Police and Neighbourhood Watch - Focus on anti-social behaviour which has involved knocking on doors and making house visits to ensure a continued police presence. They have also been working with BPHA to secure properties and they are continuing to target drug issues on the estate. Stephen reinforced the prioritisation of supporting the most vulnerable people in the community during this time of rising inflation and in the face of the energy crisis - he supported the move to give the money to the Money Advice Service Lara - suggested that funding be used to provide vouchers to support those most vulnerable. All agreed with the decision to send money across to the Money Advice Service. Decision seconded by Stephen Ferguson. Plans for the Queen's Jubilee - Helene Tame - Councils will be organising and coordinating events to celebrate the Queen's Jubilee on Thursday, Friday and Saturday of the Bank Holiday weekend in June. Local communities will be free to organise their own celebrations on the Sunday 5th June. Some streets are in the process of organising their own street parties.
