There are two groups currently in St Neots – one meeting during the day and one in the evening. They have been established in St Neots since 1946.and there are 30 thousand clubs worldwide. They describe themselves as a reliable way of delivering support to good causes and have a strong focus on local activities together with international projects such as a school in Kenya. There are 5 committees, one of which has a specific fundraising function. There is also a strong social element to the club. Activities include: Walkathon, Quiz, Race night, Guess the value of a Waitrose trolley at Christmas, Talking newspaper, Gardening for those needing help. Awards for young people for music and arts. Health related projects such as Heartwise and a stroke awareness day A satellite group could be set up on Love's Farm if there were sufficient interest. 8 Wintringham Park

Rebecca Britton from Urban & Civic, the developer of Wintringham Park did not attend as the plans were not as developed as she had expected. She will attend a later meeting. There will be a public consultation on layout and Urban & Civic are involved in discussions with councils about schools. An invitation had been extended to LFCA to visit Alconbury Weald and Rebecca had offered to arrange transport for this but it was agreed that the numbers would not warrant this and that those interested would travel by car.

Action - Any one interested to visit Alconbury Weald to liaise with Marcus.

9 Round House capacity campaign update.

There has been a recent meeting with Julie and CCC officers, which had revealed that there will be a new school for Love's Farm children in 2018, although the site is not yet confirmed. The site will be temporary in 2018 but permanent from 2019 onwards. Two existing trusts – the Diamond Trust which operates the Round House and the St Neots Learning Partnership are to bid to run the new school and there will be a public meeting on 27th September for each Trust to put forward their proposals. It is envisaged that the temporary site will be located on the existing site of the winning Trust but separate from it. There will be some changes to the application process once the new site becomes known and admissions will be open to R and Y1 children so that anyone who missed out this year will be able to apply to the new school.

There was some discussion on how originally planning permission was given for 1050 houses on Love's Farm but this was eventually increased by 20-30%.

10	Northern access update.		
	It has been agreed that the concrete block will be replaced by a key operated barrier, which be installed by the end of the month. The consultation is still in operation and so views may still be expressed The access will only be opened in "extreme" circumstances – which rather than for all emergency vehicles use, which seems to be when there is a blockage further south on the estate which prevents all vehicles getting in or out. The Fire Service have said that it would take them an additional 24 seconds if the northern access was closed. There has been no further response from Matthew Shuter.		
	There is some continuing concern over the fencing by the side of the railway. One hole in the fence has been repaired but another one has since appeared close to the Northern Access		
11	Parking scheme update.		
	CCC are taking forward the proposed spine roads parking scheme with an additional blanket 1 hour ban on side roads – although there may be some opt out for individual streets. There will be some consultation at the AGM and there is a possibility of some tweaks to the proposals. If the response is overwhelmingly negative the proposals could be rejected – the aim is for a 70% positive response. The problem will exacerbate once the parking restrictions on Longsands are enforced. There was some discussion on the impact of access protection markers.
