The chair of Love's Farm
Community Association (LFCA) Lara
Davenport-Ray has been working
with local authorities to resolve safety
concerns about the pedestrian
crossing on Hogsden Leys. This site
is complicated by a blind bend, a
chicane, variations in road markings,
on street parking and a well-used
crossing for pedestrians, cyclists and
school children

Lara presented several potential

improvements to the Town Council and Cambridge County Highways Officers. Both required changes to our ideas before the process could continue. As a result, an improvement has been proposed to remove on-street parking between the crossing and Wood Ridge Crescent on both sides of the road. LFCA has requested that this is implemented at the same time as additional on-street parking spaces further south on

Hogsden Leys. The space for additional on-street parking was created when a chicane was removed several years ago.

In January the Town Council agreed to part-fund and support an improvement proposal to the County Council. We now await a decision from the County Council on whether they will approve the scheme and commit the balance of required funding. If the scheme is approved this spring, then much more detail will be available to share with residents.

Remembering Jo Whitney

Jo Whitney, one of the longest serving and much loved teaching assistants at the Round House school, died at home after a short illness earlier in January.

Miss Whitney (as she was known by all the children) joined the school in 2009 and worked mostly with the Years 5 and 6 children, but also as part of the Magpies after-school team. When Simba the dog joined the school, she added his care to her list of duties. She could often be heard calling for him in the school corridors and slipping him titbits of food.

Miss Whitney was a larger-than-life character and a huge presence in the school. She was a great encourager and cheerleader, she was honest and hilarious, she loved school dinners and hated school trips!

She was especially brilliant with

children who were struggling, but lots of children at the school have a story to tell and a special memory of Miss Whitney to share: whether that was putting your chair on top of your desk if you hadn't pushed it under the table, messing about with school displays, telling risky jokes, sneaking treats to Simba or going 'missing' and dipping into classes just to say hello,

Miss Whitney filled the school with her humour and humanity. She loved the Round House school and the Round House school loved her. News of her death was met with a wave of sadness.

However long ago it was that you were at school, memories of your own teachers will be surfacing. Hundreds of children will be remembering Miss Whitney their whole lives long and not least because love endures. She left a double helping of love in many, many hearts.

Water Outages: Response from Anglian Water

On 18 January, Anglian Water joined the LFCA committee meeting with an update on our water supply and infrastructure

After months of frequent water outages, upgrades to the pumping station and pressure boosters were installed in November. This is located next to the railway bridge on Priory Hill. Since November our water shortages have significantly reduced.

Our frequent water losses are also a result of interruptions to the local electricity supply. Millisecond power cuts, that would not affect domestic supply, do affect Anglian's pumping stations. Our area, which includes Yelling, Toseland, and stretching across to Graffham Water have all been affected. UK Power Networks would need to significantly invest in the Grid to further reduce power cuts.

905 Bus Service

Over the past months many of you have experienced frequent cancellations on the 905 bus route to and from Cambridge. In November, Cllr Lara Davenport-Ray wrote to the CEO of Stagecoach to share our frustration with the cancellations and ask for clarity on the new 905 route.

The response from Darren Roe was disappointing but also enlightening. There are currently not enough bus

drivers but many are in training. Even more concerning is the reality that "the 905 is forecasted to be significantly loss making for [Stagecoach]" but they "have a strong marketing campaign planned for the service and as we grow the service we will be able to look further at enhancing the frequencies."

In summer 2022, Stagecoach held an open forum at Longsands School, where they committed to provide one hourly fast and one hourly stopping service to Cambridge. The feasibility of this service is equally bleak:

"The losses which we are facing on the 905 mean that we cannot afford the vehicle investment needed to

make that idea work. We have therefore listened to residents at that meeting and made the service fast down the A428 and returned it to the Madingley Road."

Mice on Love's Farm

We've had lots of reports of mice in homes around Love's Farm and Wintringham, and have gathered lots of data via social media to corroborate this.

It seems likely that the problem is field mice, Developers of the Monksfields development to the east of Love's Farm have scraped the top surface for archaeological investigations, forcing mice to leave their natural habitat.

The pest control officer at Huntingdonshire District Council has provided the following advice: If you've spotted a mouse, there's some information at www.bpca.org.uk which will help identify if it's a field mouse. If identified as field mice, then any rodenticide must not be used as this is against BPCA guidelines so only traps are allowed.

As the weather gets colder field mice that are currently surviving outside will look for warmer places to harbour and nest and try to move inside buildings and houses. Food is also scarce for them outside hence another reason why infestations are more noticeable this time of year.

Due to the design and layout of most modern properties, mice can easily access inside if the gap is more than 4mm.

The council's advice to residents is as follows:

- Cover household waste, close dustbin lids and cover compost bins where possible
- Store food in airtight containers and clear up any food spillages/ debris straight away
- Install brush strip on exterior doors if the gap is more than 4mm (width of a pencil)
- · Fit mesh air vent/brick covers
- Any gaps around the outside of properties e.g pipes, windows, doors and walls of 4mm or more should be filled with wire wool then silicone/expanding foam over the top
- · Remove any long standing items

- piled up in gardens
- If control is required then use traps inside where mice have been active but ensure the traps are placed away from children and pets.

Hunts District Council can offer a course of treatment or survey if required. Booking details can be found at www.huntingdonshire.gov.uk.

be very welcome.

There have been some very pretty hoar frosts and both sun and moon "glories", partial or full rainbow rings. So provided one steps carefully through snow, ice and mud, there are interesting things to see. On a lime tree at the end of Dramsell Rise there has been a fungus developing, despite the cold, the Alder trees have dropped their first catkins and Hazels are beginning to look pretty in sunshine. Spring is coming!
